1. Read Romans 16:25-27. Paul states that God is able to strengthen us by the gospel. In what ways are you strengthened through ...

"Paul concludes his book in praise of God's wisdom. God's wisdom is seen in Christ himself, 'in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge' (Col 2:3), above all in his cross that, though foolish to human beings, is the wisdom of God (1 Cor 1:24), in God's decision to save the world not through its own wisdom but through the folly of the gospel (1 Cor 1:21), in the extraordinary phenomenon of the emerging multiracial, multicultural church (Eph 3:10), and in his purpose ultimately to unite everything under Christ (Eph 1:7-10). No wonder Paul has already broken out in praise of God's wisdom: 'Oh, the depth of the riches of the wisdom and knowledge of God!' (11:33). No wonder he does it again at the end of his letter."

"Christians are established by the truth, which explains why Paul wrote this letter: to explain God's plan of salvation to Christians so they would be established, and so they would share the truth with the lost. - 4. If you were traveling like in Paul's day and wrote a letter to your church, who would you greet and what would you say to them?
- 5. Paul closes his letter with a prayer of praise for God's wisdom and a desire for His eternal glory. What are some ways you desire for God's eternal glory to be revealed?
- 6. Create a prayer based on Paul's closing prayer of verses 15-27. Meditate on each phrase. Pray each phrase in your own words, adding personal notes. As you near the end of the prayer, consider God's wisdom and respond to Him accordingly.

- 3. Understand that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and that He rose again. (Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)
- 4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior. (Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9) "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16 NASB) You can use this prayer to express your decision to God:
- "Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen."
