

#### LESSON THEME: The New Covenant: "Life 2.0"



#### The Mosaic Covenant

Was a conditional covenant (Deut 28–30)

Blessings require obedience

Disobedience requires discipline

Ultimate discipline is deportation from the land

Had limitations: no enablement from the inside-out (Rom 8:3)

Truths Judah now knows all too well

#### The Mosaic Covenant Was Broken

Israel has already been overrun and assimilated into the Assyrian Empire (722 BC)

Judah has just been overthrown and deported to Babylon for her persistent complacency and covenant disobedience (605-586 BC)

Covenant judgment has fallen ... and fallen hard

But God wants His people to have hope; they've been knocked down, but not out

#### He Announces the New Covenant

Through Jeremiah and Ezekiel

Jeremiah 31-33

Ezekiel 36


A "better" covenant (Jer 31:31-34)

With better blessings

With a new empowerment for obedience

Allowing a more intimate relationship with Him

## The New Covenant



#### A Better Covenant

Made with Israel and Judah (Jer 31:31)

Better because it's...

Unconditional (note recurrence of "I will ...")

Eternal (Jer 31:35-36; Ezek 37:26)

Brought in by the Messiah (Zech 9:10-11)

It will bring conversion and cleansing to God's people

Such conversion and cleansing can only be accomplished by shed blood (cf. Heb 9:22)

### With Better Blessings

Better material blessings ...

They'll be replanted in the Promised Land

The Temple will be rebuilt

A Davidic descendant will rule over them

They will again be supreme among the nations

Every promise God has ever made to them will be fulfilled completely

Better spiritual blessings ...

The forgiveness and putting away of sin (Jer 31:34; 33:8; Ezek 36:25; Micah 7:18-20)

A new mind (Jer 31:34)

A new heart (Isa 59:21; Jer 31:33; 32:39, 41; Ezek 36:26)

A new empowerment to obey God: the gift of the indwelling Holy Spirit (Joel 2:28-29; Ezek 36:26-29)

#### **New Covenant Promises**

Israel will continue and will eventually be restored to the land (Jer 32:37; 33:11; Ezek 11:17; 36:28-35; 37:21-22, 25) Jerusalem and the Temple will be rebuilt (Jer 31:38-40; Ezek 37:27-28)

Israel will again be the people of God (Isa 61:8-9; Hos 2:18-20; Jer 30:22; 31:33; 32:38-41; Ezek 11:20; 34:25-27; 37:27)

## When Will This Happen?

It wasn't fulfilled after the Babylonian exile, nor has it been fulfilled to date ...

The timing is based on Israel's conversion and repentance (Deut 30; Rom 11:26-27; Zech 9:11)

Putting away of sin, new mind and heart, Spirit

Davidic ruler (the Messiah)

It will be fulfilled in the 1,000-year-long Millennial Kingdom following the Tribulation

#### The New Covenant

Is Israel's basis for prophetic hope ...

Re-unification and restoration in the Promised Land, as well as rebuilding the city and the Temple

Is Israel's basis for spiritual renewal ...

Regeneration, renewal and empowerment for a new pleasing walk with the Lord

It's also the basis for the New Testament message

#### **Basis for the NT Message**

God's plan continues to march forward

The inauguration of the New Covenant is announced by the Messiah Himself (Mt 26:28; Mk 14:24; Luke 22:20; 1 Cor 11:25; Zech 9:11)

"This is the New Covenant in My blood ..."

The soon "cutting" of the New Covenant using His blood is the basis for the NT message

Summarized in the book of Hebrews

#### **Christ Is a Superior Person**

Christ is better than the prophets (1:1-3)

Superior message

Christ is better than the angels (1:4–2:18)

Superior messenger

Christ is better than Moses (3:1-4:16)

Superior leader

Christ is better than Aaron (5:1–6:20)

Superior priest

## **Christ Has a Superior Priesthood**

He is part of a better order (7)

Order of Melchizedek

He has a better covenant (8)

The New Covenant

Forgiveness and cleansing of sin

A new mind

A new heart

A new empowerment: the indwelling Holy Spirit

He ministers in a better sanctuary (9)

In heaven, not on the earth

He has offered better blood (10)

His Own, voluntarily offered

#### What Hebrews Teaches Us

Jesus is a superior Person to any OT figure

Superior order, sanctuary, covenant and blood

Better blood inaugurated a better covenant

A better covenant with better blessings

The putting away of sins

A new mind to know Him; a new heart to love Him

A new empowerment to obey and serve Him: the indwelling Holy Spirit

A better ministry

Every believer is a priest (1 Pet 2:5)

Every believer is His peace-making ambassador (Matt 28:19-20; 2 Cor 5:18-21)

#### The Church and Christians

Because of the finished work of Jesus (2 Cor 3)

We live under the New Covenant economy

Spiritual life not death

Inside-out transformation vs. outward obedience

Righteousness not condemnation

"Do" vs. "done"

Permanent not temporary glory

#### But Yet One Day ...

Israel will be converted (Zech 12:7-14; 13:1)

She will be restored to the land (Jer 32:37; 33:11; Ezek 11:17; 36:28-35; 37:21-22, 25)

Jerusalem and the Temple will be rebuilt (Jer 31:38-40; Ezek 37:27-28)

Israel will again be the people of God (Isa 61:8-9; Hos 2:18-20; Jer 30:22; 31:33; 32:38-41; Ezek 11:20; 34:25-27; 37:27)

She will receive her "stuff!"

## **Knowing What We've Been Given**

Through the New Covenant you and I have ...

Life, righteousness and freedom

From the penalty of sin ... forever

From the power of sin by walking in the Spirit

No longer enslaved to the flesh or to the Law which only bring frustration, misery and death

**Empowerment** 

Through the indwelling Holy Spirit of God to obey Him (lesson of Mt. Sinai)

Relationship

A new mind to know Him

A new heart to love Him

"Abba, Father!"

Jesus has already given you and me Kingdom life, "Life 2.0," now but not yet fully




"Our Lord Jesus Christ" by James Tissot

Jesus appears with his hands folded over His heart, His gaze direct, His expression composed. As Moses commanded in the Old Testament books of Numbers and Deuteronomy, Jesus wears a prayer shawl as a sign of His adherence to the rituals of Judaism.

Tissot derived this image from a larger watercolor in the series in which Jesus gives His last discourse to His disciples after the departure of Judas. He urges them to love one another as He has loved them.



## JESUS IS BETTER THE SHADOW & THE REALITY IN HEBREWS

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# THE OLD COVENANT with 'our fathers' 'in the past'

promise = shadow

fulfilment = reality

#### THE NEW COVENANT

with 'us' 'in these days'

angels = God's messengers



Jesus the Son is superior to the angels (1:2-14)



Jesus = God's Son = heir, creator, glory of God, imprint of God, sustainer, priest, Lord

the message of angels



Jesus the Son's message is superior to the message of angels (2:1-4)



the message of Jesus = his incarnation & substitutionary atonement = salvation

Moses = servant in God's house



Jesus the Son is superior to Moses (3:1-6)



Jesus = Son over God's house

Aaron (and his sons) = representative of sinners



Jesus the High Priest is superior to Aaron (4:14-5:5)



Jesus = our true High Priest = sinless representative & substitute

Melchizedek = eternal priest



Jesus the High Priest is superior to the priesthood of Melchizedek (5:6-10)



Jesus = our true High Priest = eternal priest who brings eternal salvation

Levitical priests = sinful, impermanent, weak, must offer sacrifices for themselves before offering for others



Jesus the High Priest is superior to the Levitical priesthood (7:9-28)



Jesus = our true High Priest = priest appointed by divine oath, perfect, permanent, powerful to save others, can offer himself for others

Levitical priests = serve in human tent on earth = copy & shadow



Jesus' place of service is superior to that of the Levitical priesthood (8:1-6; 9:1-5)



Jesus = our true High Priest = serves at divine throne in heaven = original & reality

Levitical priests = mediate old covenant = ineffective & obsolete



Jesus' covenant is superior to that of the Levitical priesthood (8:7-13; 9:6-10)



Jesus = our true High Priest = mediates new covenant = effective & eternal

Levitical priests = blood of animals in earthly tent, repeated sacrifices, no true redemption, outward cleansing only



Jesus' sacrifical blood is superior to that of the Levitical priesthood (9:11-28)



Jesus = our true High Priest = own blood in heaven itself, single sacrifice, eternal redemption, inward forgiveness & purification

Levitical priests = bodies of animals, continual & many, reminder of sin, no lasting sanctification or perfection, stand daily to serve



Jesus' sacrificial body is superior to that of the Levitical priesthood (10:1-18)



Jesus = our true High Priest = own body, singular & once for all, takes away sin, eternal sanctification & perfection, sits down at right hand of God

God's old covenant people = examples of faith



Jesus is superior to the people of God (11:1 - 12:3)



Jesus = God's Son = the founder & perfecter of our faith, endured the cross, seated with God

Sinai = earthly mountain, terror & fear toward God, laws & penalties = condemnation from God



Jesus' New Covenant is superior to the Old Covenant as symbolised by Sinai & Zion [12:18-24]



Zion = heavenly mountain, grace & kindness in the presence of God, forgiveness & cleansing in the blood of Jesus
