
A DISCIPLE BELIEVES

1. Read Luke 14:1, 6; John 8:31-32, 14:1-3; Acts 4:12; 1 Corinthians 15:1-8; 1 Timothy 2:5. What's the difference between an unsaved person's general belief in God and a Christian's specific belief in Christ Jesus for salvation?



3. What roles do faith and grace play when we believe in Christ for salvation? (See Hebrews 11:6; Romans 3:24; Ephesians 2:8.)

4. Why is a Christian not striving to be accepted by God?

5. How much would you say that you firmly trust in your identity in Christ and the assurance in His Word of who you are? What obstacles keep you from belief in this area?

6. Once our salvation has occurred, what belief must we lean on to sustain us each day (or even each moment!) of life as Jesus' disciple? (See John 8:31-32; 10:10.)

7. If a child of God is attempting to live by the energy of their own flesh, what does that say about their belief? How have you succumbed to this error, and what was the result?

8. After hearing this sermon and meditating on this study, what do you understand about belief that you didn't before? How will that realization change your daily life?

"Jesus knows where we need to go. Just as he promised to prepare a place in heaven for us (In 14:1-3), he also prepares a right-now-life of meaning and purpose. When we try to control it, we don't have enough wisdom or knowledge to find that ministry sweet spot. ... So hold your life loosely, forget yourself, follow Jesus, and let him take you where you need to go. Lose yourself in the mission. That's the joyful wonderland of his plan for every follower. If you have plans and strategies that aren't workingand you don't see any sign of God's blessing-retreat to the certainty of his leadership. I often pray, 'Lord, I'm your servant. I'll follow you even if it's into apparent failure, because I have no rights to success as I define it, or as the church defines it, or as my culture defines it. I'm only interested in pleasing you and being successful as you define it.' ... Every disciple dreams of living a life with great meaning and fulfillment. But that life doesn't come to people who drift about as immature converts. It only belongs to those who choose the life of transformational discipleship." **BILL HULL**

A WONDERFUL OFFER-

Being a Christian isn't based on membership in a local church or keeping a set of rules. It involves a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and an understanding of who He is and what He has done to provide man with a way to experience God's love for us. Here's how to know Jesus Christ as your personal Savior:

2. Recognize that the penalty for your sin is death-eternal separation from God and all that is good. (Romans 6:23: Hebrews 9:27)

3. Understand that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and that He rose again. (Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)

4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior. (Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9) "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16 NASB) You can use this prayer to express your decision to God: "Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen.'
