Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal His truth and wisdom as you go through this lesson.

- 1. Read John 13:12-17. Why would Jesus want His disciples to be servants?
- 2. Read also Mark 10:42-45 and Matthew 20:25-28. Why does Jesus link serving and leadership? Why is this so important?
- 3. When and why do you find it difficult to allow others to serve you? Why is it important that Christians learn to accept help from others as much as giving help?
- 4. Read 2 Timothy 2:3-5 and Philippians 2:3-4. What happens when Christians aren't humble with each other? Why is it so crucial that we live to serve one another in this temporary world the way Jesus did?
- 5. The pastor noted that serving the Lord is a form of worship. How did this point help you understand where a servant's mindset comes from?
- 6. Sometimes we must step in and serve simply because there is a need, not because we are looking to match a certain task to our spiritual giftedness. When have you served when there was simply a need, and what did it teach you about serving the Lord?
- 7. Think about someone you know who has a humble heart and is quick to serve others, no matter how small the task. What would you ask the Lord to change in you so you follow their example?
- 8. What steps do you want to take to nurture your mindset as a servant? What will need to change?

"To think well about service, we need to think biblically about the church. Simply put, local churches aren't like businesses; they're more like embassies of a great kingdom or a family in the same household. ... As Christians, we are citizens of the kingdom of heaven and local churches on earth are little embassies of that kingdom. In other words, they represent heaven on earth (Matt 16:18-19; Eph 2:19; Phil 3:20). Jesus Christ is the King of heaven's kingdom, and He rules His church through His Word-the Bible (Eph 1:19-23). ... We are citizens, soldiers even, of an otherworldly kingdom in hostile territory (Eph 6:11; 2 Tim 2:3-5). We belong to heaven, even as we live in a foreign land under the sway of an evil spiritual ruler named Satan (In 12:31; 2 Cor. 4:4; Eph 2:2). We once lived under his tyranny as enemies of God, but through the gospel, we have been transferred out of his domain and into the kingdom of God's beloved Son (Col 1:13)."

MATTHEW EMADI How Can I Serve My Church?

"God's goal for our lives is not money but maturity, not happiness but holiness, not getting but giving. God is at work making people more like His Son, and that's what Christian service is all about. Your purpose in serving isn't to build the biggest church or Sunday school class, the greatest choir, or the most efficient band of ushers. Your purpose is to build people of Christian character whom God can bless and use to build others."

"Taking care of 'the least of these' means that together, as Christ's body, we ensure that in the community each person's basic needs are met and that no one is left alone to fend for herself. In this way, at least among us, rich and poor cease to exist. The 'worries' of daily life-getting food on the table, paying the bills, caring for children, being needed and listened to-are carried together. If we cannot do this among ourselves, then what do we have to bring to the broken world? ... Only if we first learn how to be Christ's body together can we have anything distinctive to show and give as a community."

Being a Christian isn't based on membership in a local church or keeping a set of rules. It involves a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and an understanding of who He is and what He has done to provide man with a way to experience God's love for us. Here's how to know Jesus Christ as your personal Savior:

- 1. Realize that you are sinful and separated from God. (Romans 3:23; Isaiah 53:6)
- 2. Recognize that the penalty for your sin is death—eternal separation from God and all that is good. (Romans 6:23: Hebrews 9:27)
- 3. Understand that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and that He rose again. (Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)
- 4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior. (Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9) "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16 NASB) You can use this prayer to express your decision to God:
- "Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen."
