Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal His truth and wisdom as you go through this lesson.

- 1. When have you been afraid to share Christ? Why do you think many Christians are afraid to do it?
- 2. Read Matthew 28:19-20 and 2 Timothy 1:4-5. Why does God command us to evangelize?
- 3. Read Matthew 4:18-29. What does Jesus say He will do if we follow Him? Who is doing the making, and why is it so crucial for us to focus on that fact?
- 4. Why is it necessary to intentionally communicate the gospel's content in addition to living out its truths daily?
- 5. Researcher George Barna says that most Christians who share the gospel feel like failures, so they redirect their efforts into spiritual activities where they are more likely to be satisfied and successful. How have you found this to be true?
- 6. Part of becoming more Christlike is seeking forgiveness for sin in our life that makes our words and actions inconsistent with our faith. What sins are creating obstacles in your willingness to share the gospel?
- 7. Consider ways you might begin to make evangelism a spiritual discipline. What steps can you take this week to build a deeper relationship with an unbeliever? Invite them over for pizza, help them with a project?
- 8. Walk through the gospel message as if you're talking to an unbeliever. What specific things should you say?
- 9. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you to at least one person who is open to the gospel. What loving, sensitive steps are you willing to take in order to intentionally share Christ with them?

A WONDERFUL OFFER Being a Christian isn't based on membership in a local church or keeping a set of rules. It involves a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and an understanding of who He is and what He has done to provide man with a way to experience God's love for us. Here's how to know Jesus Christ as your personal Savior:

- 1. Realize that you are sinful and separated from God. (Romans 3:23; Isaiah 53:6)
- 2. Recognize that the penalty for your sin is death—eternal separation from God and all that is good. (Romans 6:23: Hebrews 9:27)
- 3. Understand that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and that He rose again. (Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)
- 4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior. (Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9) "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16 NASB) You can use this prayer to express your decision to God:
- "Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen.'

"Evangelism is not about you. Evangelism is about God and what He has done through Jesus Christ. ... It is a spiritual thing. We need to rely totally upon the Holy Spirit and love people the way God loves people. We need to see people the way God sees people. You can't manufacture love for people in the flesh. You can't conjure up evangelism. It is the Holy Spirit who works through believers to take the message of salvation to an unbelieving world. We are just tools that God chooses to use to communicate His message."

"Godliness requires that we discipline ourselves in the practice of evangelism. The reason many of us don't witness for Christ in ways that would be effective and relatively fear-free is simply because we don't discipline ourselves to do it."

"As the ground erodes beneath our feet, we tend to fight for our rights in the public square and slam our opponents on social media. We're fearful about our future. Yet fear of the future isn't necessarily the problem. We actually don't seem fearful enough, not nearly as exasperated or concerned about the certain and dreadful end of our unbelieving neighbors as we should be. ... We stand opposed to so much of what we dislike in the world, but then we live much like the world. Then we're surprised when the world sees us as phony. ... We're of the world but somehow not in it. So we must repent. We must learn and apply the proper dispositions of a church on mission, living as strangers in our own land. While these lessons are found throughout Scripture, we encounter them most clearly in 1 Peter, a letter of increasing relevance for our day and time. Because these biblical characteristics are the ones that seem so glaringly absent in the American church today."
