
THE TIMES ...

Almost 50,000 exiles returned to Jerusalem in 538 BC with a desire to resettle the land and rebuild the Temple ... but many more Jews stayed behind in Babylon

Perhaps people of more "ordinary" faith

The time came, however, when even an ordinary follower would be called upon to stand up and stand out in spite of the risk

THE BASICS ...

Who: Hadassah/Esther ("Myrtle/Star") When: postexilic (circa 470 BC) Where: to the dispersed Jewish community
Why: "... God is sovereign. Even though His name never occurs in the book, there can be no doubt that He has dominion over all nations and history itself." – Eugene Merrill

LESSON THEME: Standing up and standing out for God

Esther's Selection (1–2)

Vashti is deposed

Xerxes goes off to war against Greece and comes home defeated (483; 481-479 BC)

He needs a new queen

Esther wins the competition

She becomes queen (479 BC)

Esther's Courage (3–7)

Haman's evil plot is prompted by pride (3)

Mordecai's concern for the condemned and faith to stand up and stand out (4)

Esther's courageous intercession (5-7)

She may have been reluctant

Within the palace, perhaps she just didn't know

On Mordecai's counsel, she places herself fully in God's hands, stands up and steps out in faith

God's Deliverance (8-10)

The lot had been cast (3:7) A new law is decreed (8) The old law cannot be rescinded But a new law supersedes it The holy war (9) Compare 1 Samuel 15 Agag the Amalekite (Haman) Saul the Benjamite (Mordecai)

Epilogue: The People Worship

The Feast of Purim ("lots") Not legislated by the Law (Lev 23) Celebrated on the 14th and 15th of the twelfth month of the Jewish year (our Feb/Mar) Celebrates God's faithful and sovereign deliverance of His people


Have you put yourself fully in His hands?
