

THE BASICS ...

Who: Ezra/Nehemiah When: events 445-430 BC; written 425 BC? Where: to Jerusalem's spiritual community Why: "Thus the suggestion that Ezra-Nehemiah is mostly about community building is not far off the mark; it is indeed about rebuilding the community of God, based on the religious realities of the past."

-Gordon Fee and Douglas Stuart

LESSON THEME: God remembers those who build up His spiritual community

Nehemiah Cares (1)

He cares enough to listen

He cares enough to pray

He cares enough to sacrifice if required

He Gets Involved (2-3)

He prays for four months (cf. 1:1 with 2:1)

He has a divine appointment before the king

He makes a bold ask, though terrified (2:2)

He moves to a place he's never been before

He leaves behind comfort, ease and prestige for hardship and the unknown to build up a wall ... and to build up God's people

He involves others in the work (3)

He Endures Opposition (4–6)

From without

Sanballat the Horonite; Tobiah the Ammonite (4)

Gesham the Arab (6)

From within

Financial burdens and Tobiah's insiders (6:17)

Neither Nehemiah nor his other leaders took a food allowance for 12 years (5:14) Nehemiah inspired others by his work (5:16)

He Pursues Changed Lives (7-13)

He consecrates the people (7–10)

Registers the people

Repent, obey the Word of God and celebrate

Confession, worship and covenant renewal

He consecrates the wall (11–12)

Joyful dedication led by Ezra and Nehemiah

To give God's people protection

To give God's people a renewed identity

And he steps into the "messy-ness" of other people's lives (13)

By addressing their disobedience

By seeking their repentance and renewed obedience to the Word of God

By stressing to them their distinction from those around them

Summary of Nehemiah

Nehemiah cared

He had a sensitive heart toward God

Nehemiah got involved

In spite of the personal sacrifice required

Nehemiah endured opposition

In spite of discouragement and setbacks

Nehemiah pursued changed lives

He stepped into the messy-ness of other's lives





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
