

#### THE BASICS ...

Who: Malachi – "My messenger"
When: events 450-430 BC
Where: to the postexilic Jewish community
Why: "Malachi's purpose in writing was to rebuke Judah for her sin and to exhort her to be faithful to the Lord as she awaited God's messenger, who would herald the coming day of the Lord." – Charles Dyer

**LESSON THEME:** When love grows cold

# They Doubt God's Love (1:2-5)

God: I have loved you (1:2a)

People: How have You loved us? (1:2b)

Implications ...

You've doubted My love for you

You think I've abandoned you

They're defensive and argumentative

"If You loved us, things wouldn't be this way!"

#### They Dishonor His Name (1:6–2:9)

God: You've not shown Me respect (1:6a)

People: How have we not? (1:6b)

Here's how ...

You've given Me your leftovers ... not your best

In fact, you say it's too hard to serve Me

The truth is you have contempt for Me

Apathetic motions reveal disengaged hearts

# They Defile His Covenant (2:10-16)

God: I reject your hypocritical worship (2:13) People: You've abandoned us! (2:14a)

Here's what you've done ...

You've been unfaithful to your spouse and divorced the wife of your youth

Why would I accept such worship?

Their loyalty is first and foremost to themselves

#### They Disobey His Word (2:17–3:5)

God: I'm weary of hypocritical words (2:17a)

People: How have we wearied You? (2:17b)

Here's how ...

You call evil good and good evil

You accuse Me of injustice, yet you flaunt your unbiblical injustice against the helpless

They no longer fear the Lord

# They See No Need to Repent (3:6-7)

God: I've always been faithful to you (3:6)

People: We don't need to repent (3:7)

Implications ...

You don't see yourselves accurately

You see no need to repent

Their eyesight is growing dimmer

Their hearts are growing colder

# They Don't Live as Stewards (3:8-12)

God: You've cheated Me! (3:8a)

People: How have we cheated You? (3:8b)

Here's how ...

You've withheld your tithes and offerings

You've become self-serving rather than stewards who acknowledge and trust My provision

They've become friends of the world

# They Live for Themselves (3:13-15)

God: You've spoken against Me (3:13a)

People: How have we so spoken? (3:13b)

Here's how ...

You say there's no difference between the wicked and the righteous

You say "The worldly are better off than we are!"

They're accusing God of holding out on them

#### **But There's a Humble Remnant** (3:16–4:6)

The faithful feared Him, gathered together and vowed to obey, which pleased the Lord immensely (3:16-18)

# The Day of the Lord Is Coming (4:1-6)

"I'm coming to settle accounts with you!"

#### **APPLICATION:** When love grows cold

# Signs of a Chill

It begins with just a cool draft ...

I get busy, distracted, feel empty and maybe even blah about our relationship

But as the temperature continues dropping ...

I get surprised, confused, feel cut off, even empty

Then a chill sets in ...

I begin to doubt the Lord's love for me

I begin to withdraw and withhold my best from Him, just giving Him my leftovers

I might even start believing the Lord is asking too much from me anyway, so I increase my commitment to pursue my own happiness ... though you'd never know it to look at me

My dealings with others become increasingly hypocritical and self-serving

I lose sight of how far I've wandered, maybe denying the need for change at all

My stewardship to my church and other ministries falls off ... and I think justifiably so

I become more comfortable with the world and the worldly around me than with the righteous

Have you lost your first love?

# **Confronting a Chilly Heart**

Gather regularly with other committed believers for encouragement and exhortation (Hebrews 10:25)

Remind yourselves of God's character, His Son, His love and His past faithfulness from the Word and from your own experiences

Encourage one another to trust Jesus more

Pray for one another to walk in obedience



	Who led them?	Moses/Aaron/Joshua	Zerubbabel/Ezra/Nehemiah
	What was their purpose?	To reclaim the Promised Land	To rebuild the Temple and city of Jerusalem
	What obstacles did they face?	Red Sea/Wilderness/Enemies	Ruins/Limited Resources/Enemies
-6	What failures did they experience?	Complaining/Disobedience/ Retreat—all of which turned a journey of a few weeks into a 40-year ordeal	Fear/Discouragement/Apathy— all of which turned a project of a few months into one that required a century to complete

# Malachi: A Portrait of Spiritual Indifference


When the prophet Malachi began preaching to the Israelites, he found that the people had cold hearts. They were indifferent and apathetic. When he confronted them with their sin, they asked a series of questions that reveal volumes about their spiritual condition.


Question	Significance	Application
"In what way have You loved us?" (1:2)	This question reveals an alarming lack of trust in God. The Israelites were implying that God had been unfaithful to His covenant. "If You really love us, why are we still under foreign oppressors, waiting for the promised kingdom?"	Do we demand proof of God's love for us?
"In what way have we despised Your name?" (1:6); "In what way have we defiled You?" (1:7)	This question shows the halfheartedness and the rationalizations of the nation's religious leaders. They were saying, in effect: "We've been making the required sacrifices. What more do you want?" But as Malachi pointed out, the sacrifices offered to God were unfit animals (1:8-10).	Do we offer God our best in worship, or do we just go through the motions?
"In what way shall we return?" (3:7)	This question reveals an appalling blindness to sin and an arrogant attempt to gloss over wrongdoing. "We don't know what You want us to do, because we don't see what we have done wrong."	When faced with our sin, do we make excuses?
"In what way have we robbed You?" (3:8)	This question underscores the people's greed. They did not view their possessions as God's, to be used for His glory.	Do we gladly give to God?
"What have we spoken against You?" (3:13)	This question displays the Israelites' callousness. They had said it was "useless to serve God" (3:14). But they continued to think that their external observance of religious ceremonies would satisfy God's demands on their lives.	Do we wholeheartedly serve God?
