
# When I'm Not Where I Want to Be

DATE: 1446 to 1406 B.C.

TITLE: "The Way Out," "Departure" or "Exit"

PURPOSE: To show God's sovereign hand in fulfilling His promises to His people

# I. Sometimes God's people find themselves a long way from where they want to be.

# **DEVOTIONAL & HOME GROUP STUDY**

### Before you begin, ask the Holy Spirit to teach you and guide your study.

1. Have you ever studied the book of Exodus before? If so, what concepts do you remember? If not, what do you expect will be some themes?

2. Read Exodus 1:1-7. So far, what does Exodus seem to be about? How is this a continuation of the story God began with Adam and Eve?

3. Jewish rabbis call Exodus "The Book of Names" or "These Are the Names" because it opens with the names of the sons of Jacob (Israel) who brought their families to Egypt to escape a famine in Canaan (Gen 46). What is the significance of listing these names?

4. "The people of Israel were fruitful and increased greatly; they multiplied and grew exceedingly strong, so that the land was filled with them." (v. 7). This fact is so important that it's mentioned three times (1:7, 12, 20). To whom had God promised this would happen? Read the verses listed below for insight. Genesis 1:28

"The central events in the book of Exodus are the miraculous deliverance of Israel from Egyptian bondage and God's establishing the theocratic nation under Moses by means of a new 'constitution,' the Mosaic Covenant (19:3-19). ... The people of promise were miraculously redeemed from servitude and placed under the Mosaic Covenant so that they might become 'a holy nation' (Ex 19:6), an avenue of blessing to the Gentiles (Gen 12:3; cf. 'a light for the Gentiles,' Is 42:6). The Book of Exodus, then, stresses redemption and consecration." JOHN HANNAH

"Using the experiences of Israel as Exhibit A, the book of Exodus explains what true freedom is, what freedom costs and how it must be used. Exodus teaches us that freedom is not license and discipline is not bondage. God tells us how to enjoy mature freedom in His will, a quality that is desperately needed in our churches and in our world today. The privilege of freedom is precious; the responsibilities of freedom are serious; and we can't have one without the other. ... The Old Testament is God's 'continued story' of His great program of salvation that He announced to Adam and Eve (Gen 3:15) and to Abraham (12:1-3). That explains why the Hebrew text of Exodus begins with the Word and, for God is continuing the story He started in Genesis. God's wonderful story finally led to the coming of Jesus to earth and His death on the cross, and it won't end until God's people go to heaven and see Jesus on the throne. What a story!"

"Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen."
