DEVOTIONAL & HOME GROUP STUDY

Before you begin, ask the Holy Spirit to teach you and guide your study.

- 1. Read Exodus 1:8-14. In what sense did the new pharaoh not "know" Joseph? (For a brief primer on Joseph's role in Egypt, read Genesis chapters 41 and 50.)
- 2. Provide some examples of how you know you are living in a foreign land and how you don't belong to the culture around you. How are you feeling the heat to conform?
- 3. What are some ways God is using your time in this foreign land for His purposes, despite the adversity and difficulties?
- 4. Read 1 Peter 4:12-14. What attitude do these verses suggest the Christian needs to have, and how do they also encourage you?
- 5. God fulfilled His promise of fruitfulness even under Egyptian oppression and cruelty. What does this say about Him?
- 6. God seemed to be silent for about 400 years while God's people sojourned in Egypt. When God seems to be "silent" how do you focus on living by faith (as at all other times!) and by the principles of His Word?
- 7. What similarities do you see between these experiences of Israel and the events of these last days before our Lord's return? What does this realization cause you to want to do differently?
- 8. What principles do you glean from this passage and sermon that will help in those times when the hand of God is not evident and the forces of evil seem to prevail?
