- Out of a desire to please the Lord, children should obey their parents.
- Paul's admonition for Christian fathers to refrain from provoking their children reiterates the value of children in family.
- Bondservants were to obey their earthly masters with renewed hearts, honoring the Lord.
- Masters were to treat their bondservants fairly and justly as an act of submission to the Lord.
