- Paul wrote from prison to his faithful and capable ministry partner Titus around 62 A.D.
- Key themes in Titus include healthy local church organization, the dangers of false teaching, and the link between true faith and good works.
- Paul emphasized Christ as our Savior, who died for our sin and rescued His people from death.

Foundational Truths

- Paul served and worshipped God as he helped believers understand how to live holy lives.
- God is fully truthful so we can be fully confident in His Word.
- True ______ brings hope, understanding, and sanctification for all believers.

Commit to an ongoing pursuit of deepening faith and spiritual maturity.

Foundational Leadership

- Paul tasked Titus with establishing healthy local leadership in the Cretan churches.
- These leaders, called ______, were to be godly and trustworthy men of proven character.
- Elders were to steward and lead their own congregations with faithfulness and integrity.

Thoughtfully follow the faithful leaders whom God has given you.

Foundational Teaching

- Elders were to ______for their congregations by removing deceptive teachers and teaching truth.
- The Cretan Christians had been shaped by a corrupt culture so needed teachers and leaders who corrected their sin and taught them to pursue holiness.
- Despite claims of faith, false teachers revealed their true character and lack of belief through their words and actions.
