Lesson + Devotional

- 1. Read Exodus 25:1-9. What was the purpose of the tabernacle?
- 2. Since even the highest heavens cannot contain God (1 Kings 8:27), what does it mean that God came to dwell with His people?
- 3. Read Exodus 30:11-16. How were the tabernacle and its furnishings to be financed? What does each of these offerings say about each person's responsibility and relationship to the Lord?
- 4. From where did these offerings originally originate, and why is that important to note? (By way of review, skim over the last half of Exodus chapter 12.)
- 5. Read Matthew 18:20 and John 14:16-17, 23. During His incarnation on earth, Jesus fulfilled God's promise to tabernacle or dwell with His people. How is He dwelling among His people now?
- 6. Read Exodus 25:40. Now read Hebrews 8:1-5. What was God showing Moses? What is happening in heaven even today, according to this passage?
- 7. Why must we follow the pattern of worship given to us from heaven, not any pattern of this world (Romans 12:2)?
- 8. Read 1 Corinthians 6:12-20 and Ephesians 2:19-22. Paul speaks of believers individually and corporately as God's temple. How did this sermon enrich your appreciation of what it means to be God's holy dwelling? How will that change your daily walk with the Lord?
