2 Corinthians 12:11-13:14

SELFLESS CONCERN 12:11-18 Because the Corinthians believed the false apostles' untrue claims, Paul shared his own apostolic credentials again so they would know the truth. Paul sought the hearts of the Corinthians, not their money. Even false accusations against him did not deter Paul's commitment to the Corinthians. *Open wide your hearts to those who have* _____ their way spiritually. SACRED MOTIVES 12:19-21 Paul desired to strengthen the faith of the Corinthians, not exonerate himself. The next time Paul opened the church doors, he hoped to find a unified congregation. For the maturity of the church, Paul was willing to address any continuing sins. Assess your motives _____ you approach those who need guidance. SIN CONFRONTED 13:1-4 Paul prepared the Corinthians for his arrival by sharing his plans to purify the church. Paul planned to deal biblically with the sins he found in Corinth. Christ's power would be revealed when Paul confronted the rebellious members. Develop caring relationships, be biblically ______, and help others in God's power. SINCERE INTERCESSION 13:5-14 Living an obedient life in the Spirit of God was Paul's prayer for the Corinthians. Paul asked God to bring restoration and the blessings of the Trinity to the church. Diligently pray for the lost to be found and their return.
