HOME GROUP

Lesson + Devotional

Before you begin, ask the Holy Spirit to teach you and guide your study.

1. Read Matthew 16:13-20. The question of Christ's true identity is still debated around the world. What answers have you heard people give about Christ's identity? How have you responded to those answers?
2. Jesus asked His disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?" How did the disciples answer? What do their answers suggest about their understanding of Jesus' identity?
3. Jesus got more direct in verse 15: "Who do you say I am?" What was Simon Peter's answer? What is important about the answer he gave?
4. What significance is attached to Simon's new name?
5. Compare Jesus' words to Peter in v. 19 to His words to all the disciples in Matthew 18:18-20 and John 20:23 (refer also to your notes from the sermon). Do these verses indicate that Jesus was giving only Peter special position or privilege in the church? Why or why not?
6. How are Christians "living stones"? How does it change your daily life to understand your identity in Christ as a living stone in the church He has built?
7. How has the sermon sharpened your focus on the importance of the question of "Who do you say I am?" Where does your answer to that question come from?
8. Jesus' question *Who do you say that I am?* is an example of one of His teaching methods. Asking a question demands engagement, promotes thinking and draws out a considered response. How can this question become a tool you can use with others when talking about Jesus?

HELPFUL Quotes

... Peter himself is the rock, but in a special sense. He is not the rock on which the Church is founded; that rock is God. He is the first initial foundation stone of the whole Church. ... In other words, Peter was the first member of the Church, and, in that sense, the whole Church is built on him. - Warren Wiersbe

The next key word in this important verse is "church." The only occurrences of this word (Gr. *ekklesia*) in all four Gospels are here and in 18:17. The Greek word refers to an assembly of people called out for a particular purpose. It comes from the verb *ekkaleo*, "to call out from." ... Jesus used it here with a new meaning. Matthew used the term *ekklesia* to refer to a new entity that was yet to come into existence. Jesus said that He would build it in the future. He would not yet establish His kingdom on earth, but He would build His church. Furthermore, Jesus claimed the church as His own in a unique sense by calling it "My church." Jesus revealed the existence of this new entity here for the first time in history. - Tom Constable

A WONDERFUL Offer

Being a Christian isn't based on membership in a local church or keeping a set of rules. It involves a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and an understanding of who He is and what He has done to provide man with a way to experience God's love for us. Here's how to know Jesus Christ as your personal Savior:

1. Admit that you're a sinner, separated from a holy and perfect God.
(Romans 3:23; Isaiah 53:6)
2. Understand that the penalty for your sin is death – eternal separation from God and all that is good.
(Romans 6:23; Hebrews 9:27)
3. Believe that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and conquered death by rising from the dead.
(Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)
4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior from sin and death and your provider of true and eternal life.
(Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9)

You can use this prayer to express your decision to God:

Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in him alone as the only way to be reconciled to you. Thank you for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen.
