3. What did Jesus say we must do to be His followers, and what is the cost?

4. How was Jesus' question in verse 26 really a warning? How is the warning especially applicable to those who live in an affluent society such as ours?

5. What does it mean for a Christian to take up a cross? Give some examples.

6. What is one way you feel led to deny your own will for Christ's sake?

7. What change in your weekly schedule could you make to better reflect what God considers important in this passage?

HELPFUL Quotes

To deny self does not mean to deny *things*. It means to give yourself wholly to Christ and share in His shame and death. Paul described this in Romans 12:1-2 and Philippians 3:7-10, as well as in Galatians 2:20. To take up a cross does not mean to carry burdens or have problems. (I once met a woman who told me her asthma was the cross she had to bear!) To take up the cross means to identify with Christ in His rejection, shame, suffering and death. But suffering always leads to glory. - Warren Wiersbe

For a disciple of Christ to take up his cross is for him to be willing to start on a death march. To be a disciple of Jesus Christ is to be willing, in His service, to suffer the indignities, the pain and even the death of a condemned criminal. Obviously the extent of suffering and persecution varies from believer to believer, from time to time, and from place to place. ... Not every disciple is called on to be martyred, but every disciple is commanded to be *willing* to be martyred. - John MacArthur

A WONDERFUL Offer

Being a Christian isn't based on membership in a local church or keeping a set of rules. It involves a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and an understanding of who He is and what He has done to provide man with a way to experience God's love for us. Here's how to know Jesus Christ as your personal Savior:

1. Admit that you're a sinner, separated from a holy and perfect God.
(Romans 3:23; Isaiah 53:6)
2. Understand that the penalty for your sin is death – eternal separation from God and all that is good.
(Romans 6:23; Hebrews 9:27)
3. Believe that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and conquered death by rising from the dead.
(Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)
4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior from sin and death and your provider of true and eternal life.
(Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9)

You can use this prayer to express your decision to God:

Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in him alone as the only way to be reconciled to you. Thank you for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen.
