HOME GROUP

Lesson + Devotional

Before you begin, ask the Holy Spirit to teach you and guide your study.

1. Read John 6. What did Jesus mean when He said, "I am the bread of life"?
2. Why was "eat my flesh and drink my blood" (v. 54) a hard teaching for potential disciples to accept? How easy is it for you to live by this teaching?
3. Why did many of Jesus' disciples cease to follow Him after hearing the discourse in verses 25-59? Why didn't the Twelve abandon Jesus?
4. Has there ever been a time in your life when you had to surrender your expectations of God because your plan didn't come to fruition? How did the disappointment affect you, and did it push you toward or away from Him? Why?
5. John contrasts Jesus with the bread the Jews mistakenly sought—manna and the Law. What kinds of "bread" do modern people seek to satisfy their hungers?
6. In Jewish culture bread symbolized the Law, but only Jesus, as the real bread, truly satisfies, unlike the Law. In verses 27-59, the people want Jesus to reenact the miracle of manna that God used to feed the Israelites for 40 years. List the things Jesus says about the real bread of God.
7. Are you still looking for sustenance in anything less than the true bread? Or have you eaten and drunk Jesus once for all, and do you eat and drink Jesus regularly? How is this affecting your life?
8. What truth from the sermon will you actively apply to your life this week?

A WONDERFUL Offer

Being a Christian isn't based on membership in a local church or keeping a set of rules. It involves a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and an understanding of who He is and what He has done to provide man with a way to experience God's love for us. Here's how to know Jesus Christ as your personal Savior:

1. Admit that you're a sinner, separated from a holy and perfect God. **(Romans 3:23; Isaiah 53:6)**
2. Understand that the penalty for your sin is death – eternal separation from God and all that is good. **(Romans 6:23; Hebrews 9:27)**
3. Believe that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and conquered death by rising from the dead. **(Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)**
4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior from sin and death and your provider of true and eternal life. **(Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9)**

You can use this prayer to express your decision to God:

Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in him alone as the only way to be reconciled to you. Thank you for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen.
