THE INNOCENT SUFFERER

19:1-6

- Pilate continues to declare Jesus guiltless and yet subjects Him to significant suffering.
- Despite the Jewish leaders' persistent false accusations, John emphasizes Jesus' _____ and presents Him as the perfect unblemished sacrifice.
- Jesus willingly endures extreme physical and emotional suffering, culminating in experiencing the full punishment for sin and the holy wrath of God.

THE LOVING AND JUST KING

19:7-16

- As the Roman leader, Pilate gives in to the pressure of the Jewish leaders and the crowds and delivers Jesus to be crucified.
- Rather than using His authority unjustly, Jesus satisfies and highlights the justice of God not by overlooking sin but by paying the price for it.
- Unlike any earthly king before or after, Jesus perfectly leads and completely _____.

THE ONLY SUBSTITUTE

19:17-27

- "Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews" is crucified as soldiers and opponents mock Him, while a few loving family and friends stand nearby.
- Fully God and fully man, Jesus accomplishes what no other animal or human could; He alone is able to atone for sin and to save.
- Jesus not only takes Barabbas' place physically but also stands in the place of _____ sinners who trust in Him.

JOHN 11:45-50, 53

Many of the Jews therefore, who had come with Mary and had seen what he did, believed in him, but some of them went to the Pharisees and told them what Jesus had done. So the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered the council and said, "What are we to do? For this man performs many signs. If we let him go on like this, everyone will believe in him, and the Romans will come and take away both our place and our nation." But one of them, Caiaphas, who was high priest that year, said to them, "You know nothing at all. Nor do you understand that it is better for you that one man should die for the people, not that the whole nation should perish." ... So from that day on they made plans to put him to death.

LEVITICUS 22:18b-21

...When any one of the house of Israel or of the sojourners in Israel presents a burnt offering as his offering, for any of their vows or freewill offerings that they offer to the Lord, if it is to be accepted for you it shall be a male without blemish, of the bulls or the sheep or the goats. You shall not offer anything that has a blemish, for it will not be acceptable for you. And when anyone offers a sacrifice of peace offerings to the Lord to fulfill a vow or as a freewill offering from the herd or from the flock, to be accepted it must be perfect; there shall be no blemish in it.

1 PETER 1:18-19

...knowing that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot.

ISAIAH 53:5-6

But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

ROMANS 3:23-26 (NLT)

For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard. Yet God, in his grace, freely makes us right in his sight. He did this through Christ Jesus when he freed us from the penalty for our sins. For God presented Jesus as the sacrifice for sin. People are made right with God when they believe that Jesus sacrificed his life, shedding his blood. This sacrifice shows that God was being fair when he held back and did not punish those who sinned in times past, for he was looking ahead and including them in what he would do in this present time. God did this to demonstrate his righteousness, for he himself is fair and just, and he makes sinners right in his sight when they believe in Jesus.

EPHESIANS 5:2b

...Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

ROMANS 5:8

...but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

HEBREWS 9:12

...he (Christ) entered once for all into the holy places, not by means of the blood of goats and calves but by means of his own blood, thus securing an eternal redemption.

1 PETER 2:24

He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed.
