43:1-7

- While Judah is in exile in Babylon, the Lord speaks words of hope and encouragement to His people.
- Just as God rescued His people from Egypt, He promises to be with them as He delivers them from exile.
- The _____ of God's tender love and care permeates His words and reveals His character.

The Supreme Savior

43:8-15

- Isaiah uses the imagery of a courtroom to call God's people to witness before the nations to His true nature.
- God highlights that He, and He _____, is the supreme savior in heaven and earth.
- God's power knows no equal, and His deliverance proves undefeated against every force that rises against it.

The Forgiving Savior

43:16-25

- Isaiah shares God's guarantee that He will bring His people home from Babylonian exile.
- Though the people's sin grieves Him, God offers the hope of forgiveness and restoration, ultimately to be found in _____.
